 Back by popular demand is our leaf pickup service. We are asking that you only take leaves to the sidewalk area. Please don't pile them up in the road. The leaf service will continue throughout the fall.
 Our DPW will also be putting up seasonal flags throughout the Village in November.
 What a summer it has been with projects. Your patience has been greatly appreciated. We were able to finish a major water project on Third Street.
 The new bridge looks wonderful and Seneca Road should last for many years. We wished we could have constructed new curbs, but state and federal regulations to apply for grants for curbs and sidewalks limited our ability.
 We will look for self funding these projects ourselves.
 At this time as I write this letter, it looks like St. James Hospital will

now be built at the old K-Mart Plaza on Seneca Road—using the plaza and the corn field. I think this would be an ideal location. Obviously, we will look into the traffic using Seneca Road through the Village. Though we have limited available land, there are homes that will be built in the Village next spring. Also, we have a Village resident who would like to build "high-end" townhouses in our

Village.
 We now have finished our major projects. North Hornell's roads, buildings and equipment are now updated for many years, still while keeping taxes down to one of the lowest in the state. 

Fire Department News.....

Dear Fellow Village Residents:

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your outpouring of continued support that you give us through our booster drive, car washes, different types of dinners and boot drive. The generosity and support never ceases to amaze me. Without the continued support that you give us, many things would not be able to be accomplished. One thing we are unfortunately working on is outfitting our firefighters with body armor in the wake of all of the shootings aimed towards firefighters and all emergency workers throughout the country. So again I would like to reiterate **THANK YOU** from everyone in the department.

Now let's not forget it is once again that time of year that we all dread. So on that note please remember to change your batteries in your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. Carbon monoxide is a silent killer. It is a byproduct of combustion and can be fatal. So please be sure to have carbon monoxide detectors installed and working throughout your home or business. Also, be sure all of your smoke detectors are installed and working properly throughout your home. To some it may seem very trivial but sadly enough each year nearly 4,000 Americans die and another 20,000 are injured in fires, many of which could have been prevented if smoke detectors were present. Also, before you use your wood stove or fire place, be sure to have your chimney cleaned and inspected. A small price to pay to prevent a very tragic event that could happen. On another note, always have an escape plan. Have 2 ways out and an agreed upon meeting point for the entire family. October is fire prevention month and we have many events going on at the station. If you would like more information, please feel free to stop by and we would be happy to help you in any way we can. Also this month don't forget on Halloween we are having our annual Kid's Party, —safe hours and haunted house! Feel free to stop by from 6PM to 8PM. Our annual Christmas parade is scheduled for December 17, 2016. We are currently at 26 active firefighters and are always looking to add to our ranks. We also have a junior firefighter program that is available to young men and women ages 16-18. For more

Information, about how to join or if you would like information about the fire department, feel free to contact me at the fire station on our non emergency number 324-1033. For Emergencies always dial 911.

Follow us on our Face Book page—North Hornell Volunteer Fire Department. We are at the station every Tuesday night from 7PM to 9PM for you to stop in. Many of you may already know, but we were able to secure two Assistance to Firefighters Grant from FEMA for 2015. One is a regional grant for an upgrade to the radio systems which encompasses 5 other departments. This is a regional grant with the total amount being \$660,000. With the securing of the grant for radios, this will put us on the right track for when the county changes the radio system from low band to high band. This will also give us the ability to communicate better with each other and law enforcement. With the way today's world is, this is a huge step in the right direction. The second grant was to upgrade our vehicle extrication equipment to include hurst tools (jaws of life), airbags for lifting heavy objects, stabilization jacks and cribbing to make working on or around wrecked vehicles safer for our firefighters. This grant also includes new larger capacity bottles for our cascade system, which will allow us to properly fill our new air packs that we received on the AFG 2014 grant that had a total value of \$129,000.. The total for the 2015 AFG grant is \$67,000 We were also able to secure the DEC grant which allowed us to upgrade the scene lighting on several of our fire apparatus. The total of this grant is \$4,000. As I said earlier, these grants have enabled us as a department to upgrade some of our aging equipment with virtually no cost to the tax payers. If you would like to know more about the new equipment that we received, please feel free to contact me or stop by the fire station and see us and we will be happy to speak to you. Yes, your sewer bill can be paid ahead. We have had a lot of residents ask if they can pay for the full year in advance. The Village fiscal year starts on June 1st and that is when taxes and your first quarter sewer bills go out. At that time you can pay all four quarters of sewer rents.

We have been sending out reminders to those residents who have not yet paid their Village property tax. These payments need to be into the clerks office no later than October 31st. After that date, all unpaid taxes will be sent to the County and will be levied onto your Town & County tax.

A reminder that all payments for taxes or sewer may be put in the black mail/drop box in front of Village hall. This is a secured box and any correspondence to the Mayor or Trustees may be put in this box.

Some things to keep in mind:

- *D Clerk Marie Patti is a Notary Public call Village hall to make an appointment for notary services
- *Maple City Lions has provided the Village with a collection box for used eye glasses
- *Tickets will be issued this winter for any vehicles parked on the streets that hinder snow plowing
- *If you start a project without a building permit there is a \$50 fee attached to permit cost. Make sure you call Village hall to verify that you need one.
- *Residents are required to shovel snow on their sidewalks that are traveled by the public
- *Village elections will be next March and there will be two trustee seats open. If you are interested in running, stop by

Village Hall for information

- *We have 2 part time police officers on duty. To contact them call Village Hall and they will get back to you. In an emergency always call 911
- *If you have any questions about your assessment or exemptions, contact the assessor in the Town of Hornellsville
- *Brush pick up in the Village is all Year long. Pick up is the second and last Monday of the month
- *All contractors working in the Village must be licensed. Applications are available at Village Hall Make sure your contractor has one.



Questions From our New Residents.....

When are Village Board meetings held? On the second Monday of every month. If it falls on a holiday, it will usually be on the following day. Changes are posted in the Evening Tribune Laser ads.

Does the Village have leaf pickup in the fall? Yes we do!

What do I do if my water is dirty? We recommend that you first call the City of Hornell water department. They handle all water issues. It is also a good idea to let us know if and where there is a problem in the Village.

Do I need a building permit to put up a fence.? Yes! Please call Village hall and we will give you all the necessary paperwork and put you in touch with the code enforcement officer. Not everything needs a permit, but it is best to check with us first. Remember to call and verify that your contractor is licensed to work in the Vil-

lage.

Who do I call if I have a question about my assessment? Call Katherine Deal at the Town of Hornellsville. She can answer all your questions and help to lower

your assessment if possible. If not, grievance day is the last Tuesday in the Month of May. Village hall mails out the Village taxes June 1st.

Where do I get my dog licensed? Dogs are licensed in the Town of Hornellsville, 1 Park Dr. in Arkport. **Cats** are licensed in the N Hornell at Village Hall.

When is trash picked up? Every Thursday, unless it is a holiday then it is the following day. Recycling is once a month on the Thursday that falls in the week of the 21st. You can always take your recyclables to the City if once a month is not enough.

Can I tap my sump pump into the sewer? No. It is illegal according to Village, State and DEC to tap into sewer lines with a sump pump. Talk to the DPW if you have questions.
