MAYORS OPENING REMARKS

A 90 gallon trash can be rented from Lippincott's at \$2.00 per month. Similar trash receptacles can be purchased at Lowes for \$79.00.

There was a rental respective that had 20 begs at the ourh. The Mayor called Lippincott's to remove them.

There was a rental property that had 20 bags at the curb. The Mayor asked Lippincott's to remove them. A letter will be sent to the property owner stating only 5 bags.

Trustee Joseph Dick suggested that we find out what can be put out for trash removal and put it in the newsletter. Should also note the time of day residents can start putting trash out.

Mayor thanked the Fire Department members, Bob Lee and a grant writer who have completed work on a grant for a new pumper tanker. He submitted a letter and forms to FEMA for a \$285,500 grant.

There are unsightly rental properties in the Village that the Mayor and CEO Scheider will be visiting and acting on.
