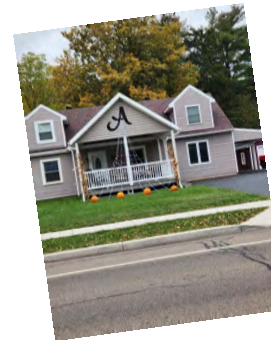

Fire Department Chief - Mike Robbins

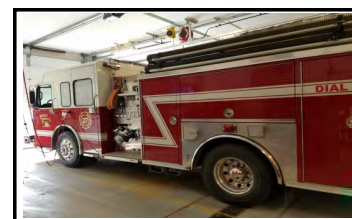

North Hornell Police Department – OIC - Kyle Amidon

The Village of North Hornell Police Department continues to serve and protect the property and residents of the Village of North Hornell. We currently are at full staff including a School Resource Officer and providing the hours budgeted in the community. The employees are doing a wonderful job and continue to meet with the residents and appreciate all the support they receive.

Chief Amidon and his staff continue to work very hard upgrading the department and equipment to provide the best service they can to you. With the support from you and the North Hornell Village Board we are able to purchase necessary equipment needed to keep our officers safe and serve you.

Within this year alone the department has received over \$170K in grants which has been used to purchase and outfit the Village of North Hornell with a new patrol vehicle for the School Resource Officer, the purchase of new portable radios to replace 20 year old plus radios, the addition of two new base radio systems added the department office and school resource officer office at the North Hornell School which will now give the officers the ability to communicate with 911 along with other emergency members, the purchasing of speed signs to assist with traffic control on Cleveland Avenue and Seneca Road, Addition of new Village Cameras to assist with security coming into and out of the village, along with the purchases of other safety equipment for the department and the officers.

Chief Amidon would like to remind all residents to continue to submit property check request forms prior to going on vacation to the North Hornell Village Hall and please complete all categories. Officers will do their best to complete routine property checks at your residences during your time away. A reminder to all residents that we are not a personal security service and cannot provide correspondence and feedback every time we check your residence. We will document our findings within our reporting writing system and contact you with any issues. Please respect this and our officers for their work and additional services.


Chief Amidon would also like to also remind residents to drop your or your loved ones outdated or over stocked prescription medication at the Prescription Drug Drop Box located at North Hornell Village Hall located at 4 West Maplewood Avenue during Village Hall Hours. This will eliminate from flushing hazardous material into our sewer lines along with the dangers of others getting their hands on them. Over the past six months the Village of North Hornell Prescription Drug Drop Box brought in over 50 pounds of unused prescription medications which is great!

SNOW REMOVAL



Every owner or the person in charge of any house, building, church or public ground shall keep the sidewalk in front of the same clear and free from obstruction and shall clear such sidewalk of snow and ice within 24 hours of snow fall.

Appearance tickets will be issued to offenders per LL113-21-23.



FIRE HYDRANTS IN THE VILLAGE

It is illegal to block a fire hydrant with snow or any other debris. If there is a hydrant on your property, please make sure it is clear at all times.

BUILDING CONTRACTORS

All contractors doing work in the Village of North Hornell must be approved by the Village Police Department, the Mayor or Clerk and the Code Enforcement Officer.

This can take up to a week for background checks to be completed.

All contractors that work in North Hornell must be licensed annually and have liability insurance. Any contractor starting work without a license will be charged a \$50.00 Fee.

There is a list of current contractors available at the Clerk's Office for your convenience. It is important for you to know if your contractor is licensed and has updated their insurances with the Village.



NEW BUILDING PERMITS

Building permit applications are the responsibility of the homeowner. There will be an additional fee of (\$100.00) plus \$50.00 every day after if you start your project without a permit. Once a permit is turned in to the clerk's office, the Code Enforcement Officer will contact you to go over your project and then you will receive a signed permit to place in your window. Permits can be obtained at the Clerk's office during regular business hours. Please make sure to plan ahead.

Code Enforcement monitors projects from start to finish. At the completion of every project, Code Enforcement will issue a Certificate of Occupancy or Certificate of Completion. If you have not received either of these documents and had work done, **please contact Code Enforcement Officer Bill Rusby at 607-382-5049** or the Clerks Office to obtain your Certificate.

It is that time of the year again when you will be clearing the sidewalks and driveways of snow. It is very important to remember that it is illegal to deposit snow, grass, leaves or any other debris on any public roadway

2024-25 Winter Parking Laws

With the winter months on the horizon, we feel that it is very important to review the parking rules on all roadways within the Village of North Hornell limits.

Parking on all Village Streets is not permitted between December 1st and March 1st from 2:00 am-6:00 am.

If your vehicle is parked during those hours, you may be subject to a parking ticket from the North Hornell Police Department for each instance.

During this time of the year, it is necessary for our staff to plow roads during the inclement weather. Plowing often occurs during the early morning hours. Vehicles parked on the roadway make it difficult.

We would like to thank you in advance for your assistance with this matter.



- Specifically, Article 1219 of New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law makes it illegal to put your snow into a street or highway. The law covers a number of other hazards to people **driving** in the street, and violating it could lead to a \$150 fine and even 15 days in jail
- Article 131-11 of the North Hornell Village code reads: No vehicle shall be parked on any public roadway within the corporate limits of the Village of North Hornell between the hours of 2:00 AM – 6:00 AM during the period beginning December 1st and ending March 1st of the year.

This law is on the books to allow the Village of North Hornell Department of Public Works to adequately clear the roads of snow for the safety of all who operate motor vehicles on them.

Questions From our New Residents.....

When are Village Board meetings held? On the second Monday of every month. If it falls on a holiday, it will usually be on the following day. Changes are posted on the website.

Does the Village have leaf pickup in the fall? Yes we do!

What do I do if my water is dirty? We recommend that you first call the City of Hornell water department. They handle all water issues. It is also a good idea to let us know if and where there is a problem in the Village.

Do I need a building permit to put up a fence? Yes!

Please call Village hall and we will give you all the necessary paperwork and put you in touch with the code enforcement officer. Not everything needs a permit, but it is best to check with us first.

Remember to call and verify that your contractor is licensed to work in the Village.



Who do I call if I have a question about my assessment? Call Katherine Gabriele at the Town of Hornellsville. She can answer all your questions and help to lower your assessment if possible. If not,

grievance day is the last Tuesday in the Month of May. Village hall mails out the Village taxes June 1st.

Where do I get my dog licensed? Dogs are licensed in the Town of Hornellsville, 1 Park Dr. in Arkport. **Cats** are licensed in N Hornell at Village Hall.

When is trash picked up? Every Thursday, unless it is a holiday then it is the following day. Recycling is once a month on the Thursday that falls in the week of the 21st. You can always take your recyclables to the City if once a month is not enough.

Can I tap my sump pump into the sewer? No. It is illegal according to Village, State and DEC to tap into sewer lines with a sump pump. Talk to the DPW if you have questions.

Can I get my handicap tag at Village Hall? Yes. Bring in your doctors authorization form for a temporary or permanent tag.
